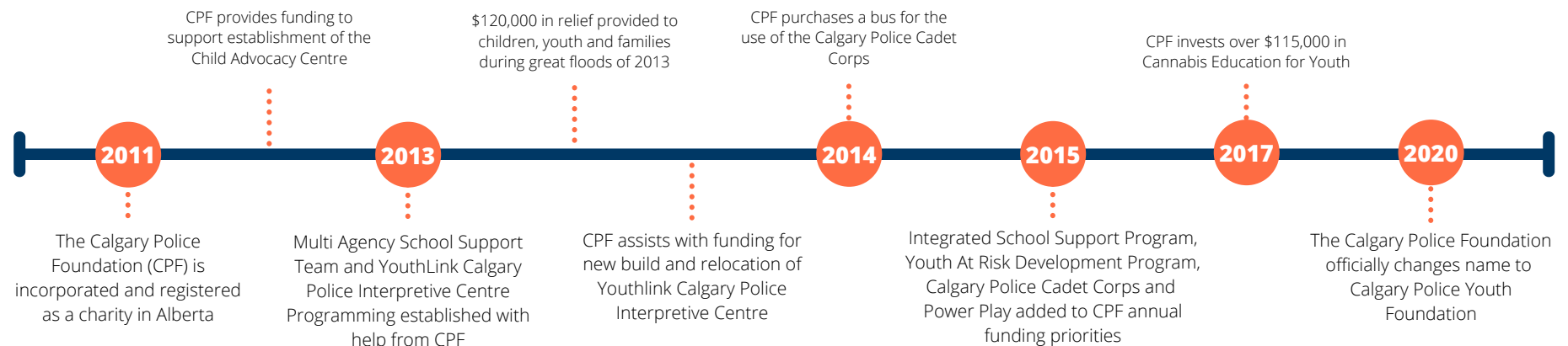




# About the Calgary Police Youth Foundation

We accomplish this goal by supporting child-youth Programming and community initiatives that provide education, prevention, early intervention and risk reduction resources for children and youth ages 5 to 18.

# Program Overview

**Integrated School Support Program (ISSP)** – ISSP is an intensive, crime prevention initiative that provides wraparound support services to two elementary schools (K - Grade 6) in Calgary's N.E community of Forest Lawn. Through its comprehensive model, ISSP has successfully helped to improve academic performance and the social, emotional, and physical well-being of students.



368 students enrolled in schools supported by ISSP



38 Indigenous students enrolled



167 (45%) students have English as a second language

**Multi Agency School Support Team (MASST)** – MASST is an early intervention, school-based program that supports children 5-12 years old who are exhibiting behavior which puts them at risk for negative, possibly criminal patterns of behaviour or victimization into teen years. The children and their families work closely with teams of police officers, registered social workers, and mental health care professionals to achieve their long-term goals.



12 MASST Teams comprised of a social worker and Calgary Police Service Officer



Average of 133 children in the program at any given time



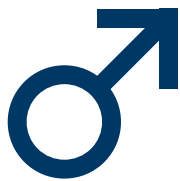

# Program Overview

**Youth at Risk Development (YARD) Program** – YARD is a community-based, early intervention program that supports youth ages 10-17 that are currently at risk, affiliated with a gang, or involved in gang activity. YARD Teams work closely with the youth client, their families, schools, and community agencies to achieve goals in the following areas: improving interpersonal relationships, improving mental health and wellness, increased life skills and increased pro-social activities.



82% of YARD clients are male



27% of clients are Indigenous



111 Clients on Caseload in 2020

**Youthlink Calgary Police Interpretive Centre** – YouthLink Calgary delivers relevant and captivating content, provoking youth to confront the issues of their time, make positive life choices and become responsible citizens in their communities. Youth and their families learn about the most pressing issues of their time, become empowered to make good decisions, and keep away from crime and victimisation through educational exhibits focused on gangs, drugs, bullying, online safety, healthy relationships, and forensics. YouthLink Calgary provides something for all ages.



60% of Grade 6 students in Calgary attended Youthlink field trips in 2019



23,500 children were enrolled in virtual education programs in 2020



300% increase in demand for crime prevention and forensic programming in 2020

**Calgary Police Cadet Corps** – The Calgary Police Cadet Corps engages our city's youth ages 12-18 in a positive way by focusing on policing, while offering opportunities to improve leadership skills, gain education through experience, build team skills and enhance physical fitness – all with the support of the Calgary Police Service. Sadly, due to the ongoing pandemic, the Cadet Corp Program had to defer in-person activities during 2020 until September 2021.



103 Cadets were enrolled in the program at the start of 2020

**Power Play** – Power Play is a free, weekly drop-in program that engages youth ages 6 - 17 and creates opportunities for participants to skate and play soccer while interacting with CPS officers in a safe and supportive environment. Power Play provides Calgary's youth with healthy physical activity during the critical after-school hours (a time when youth are most likely to be tempted by high-risk, criminal behaviour) while building relationships between communities and the Calgary Police Service.



Power Play has an average of 65 participants each week

# 2019 Highlights

In 2019, the Calgary Police Youth Foundation hosted many exciting “fun-raisers” that brought awareness to the importance of education and prevention initiatives designed to keep children and youth safe. Read about some of our favorites below.

## Family HEROES Celebration

Our Family HEROES Celebration was a hoot! Hosted at Calgary Police Service HQ, this event saw guests dress up as their favourite superheroes and take part in games, interactive displays, photobooths and a fun magic show!

## Boston Pizza Badge Day

On September 12, 2019, we partnered with all 21 Boston Pizza locations in Calgary to host Boston Pizza Badge Day. Throughout the day, 10% of food profit sales were donated to the Calgary Police Youth Foundation! Our friends at the Calgary Police Service also took part in this special day by dropping by the restaurants and chatting with dinner guests.







### **Paws for Compassion**

We partnered with our friends at the Calgary Police Service's Victim Assistance Support Team (VAST), the Pacific Assistance Dogs Society (PADS), and local Calgary bakery, Jelly Modern Doughnuts to run a three-week long doughnut delivery campaign called Paws for Compassion! Corporate partners and businesses ordered our custom doughnut throughout the month of May and profits benefitted both CPYF and PADS. Dogs and donuts made for a winning combination to this successful fundraising campaign!

### **Calgary Police Service Canine Calendars**

Our Canine Calendar campaign is a fan favorite. This annual calendar featured stunning photographs of the Calgary Police Service Canine Unit dogs and their handlers brought to you by talented volunteer photographers. We also partnered with our friends at Safeway and Sobeys once again to distribute the calendars at their stores, while also hosting a variety of pop up shops in the downtown core. Hope you were lucky enough to meet our fine Police Service Dogs who were at select locations.



# Our Impact in 2020

**13,000** children and youth served by programs supported by the Calgary Police Youth Foundation in 2020

**700** holiday hampers were provided to children and youth in Calgary which were filled with grocery gift cards, food, personal care items, books, and gifts



**350** Indigenous students attending schools in Calgary were provided with backpacks filled with school supplies and healthy snacks to start the school year off with the tools they needed to succeed!

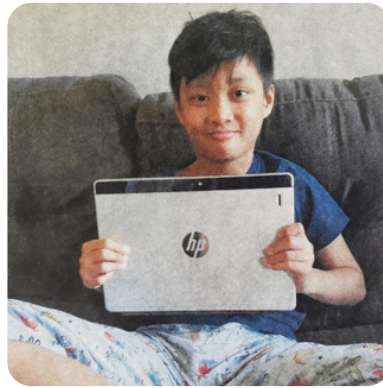


**300** Calgary Cares Boxes were provided to families to support them during the early stages of the pandemic. Care boxes included food items, sports equipment, personal care items, grocery gift cards and mental health wellness resources



**249** campers attended YouthLink summer camps where they learned about drugs, gangs, bullying, healthy relationships, and cyber safety

**75** laptops and Chromebooks were provided to families in ISSP, MASST and YARD to help with learning or working from home



Bikes were provided to children in ISSP and MASST to help them stay active at home

**275** Sport Chek activity kits were provided to children in ISSP to help keep them active while at home during school closures

**25** children attended the Power Play Pass It On event in August where they were provided with a new soccer ball, jersey, and snacks while learning soccer drills with a soccer pro





# COVID-19 Response

The COVID-19 pandemic had a profound impact on lives and livelihoods in 2020 and provincial lockdowns and school closures impacted our ability to support the children and youth we serve in the usual ways. Kudos to the Program teams as they got innovative and adapted quickly to ensure Program goals to keep children and youth safe from crime and victimisation were met – safely from a distance.

## Alternatives

While it was not always easy, Program teams were determined to leave no child behind. In-person get togethers transitioned to virtual meetings over Zoom for counselling sessions and mentor meetings. Grocery cards and restaurant gift cards were provided in lieu of school meal programs. Sport activities were moved outdoors, and supplies sent home for children to work on physical activities safely from home.

## Family Navigator

The Family Navigator role was created to support families in connecting with available resources that they needed during the early stages of the pandemic. This position was invaluable for families dealing with poverty, food insecurity and the overwhelming nature of the situation resulting in not knowing how and where to seek help.

## Community Initiatives

We recognised early into the pandemic that in order to support a child at home, it was necessary to assist the whole family. In order to do that, we established community Programs providing food assistance, technology, school supplies, hot meals, and sporting equipment to families in need. Judging by the volume of heartfelt thank-you letters we received, we know that we provided the right help at the right time.

While it wasn't the extravagant Gala event we had originally planned for, we were so excited to still be able to gather and celebrate the achievements of Vesko, Scott, Giovanni, Nathan, Mateo and Mamdouh.

In the evening, we were joined by Chief Constable Neufeld and Mrs. Neufeld, our Chief Youth Courage Award sponsors, family, and friends as we gathered to celebrate Mr. Dick Haskayne and the impact his philanthropy has had on the Calgary community.
