
GET YOUR SMILE COOKIES IN SUPPORT OF CPYF

CYBER SAFETY EVENT AT BUCHANAN SCHOOL

Last week, CPYF partnered with CPS District 3 Office to provide 10 tablets and an educational cyber safety presentation to students at Buchanan School. These new devices will help meet the increased need for technological resources for students in the community while allowing the school to utilize them for years to come. They will also help students to stay connected with teachers and peers, complete required course work, and learn how to stay safe while interacting in a digital environment.

As part of the event, students and parents were also given an educational cyber safety presentation by Mike Kim, an educator at the YouthLink Calgary Police Interpretive Centre, where they learned how to stay safe in an online environment.



This event is one of many initiatives planned for 2023 between the Calgary Police Youth Foundation and the Calgary Police Service as a part of the Bridges to Brighter Futures program – proudly supported by Shaw Family Foundation. Bridges to Brighter Futures provides children and youth the opportunity to positively interact with CPS officers in their community while learning about staying safe from victimisation and crime.

The event also included games, a petting zoo, and even a special visit from the Calgary Police Service Canine Unit and Mounted Unit.
