Camp Courage Calgary is a week-long, free camp for young women, girls and gender diverse youth ages 15–18 who are interested in pursuing a career as a first responder. The camp provides participants with the opportunity to gain firsthand knowledge of what it is like to work in emergency services, while empowering them to reach their full potential through information, education, and inspiration.

Camp Courage unites guest speakers, fitness professionals and women who are currently serving as first responders to share their experiences with participants and to provide mentorship for those considering a similar career.

Camp Courage Calgary is a collaborative initiative delivered by the Calgary Police Service, Calgary Fire Department, Alberta Health Services and YouthLink Calgary. It is funded by the Calgary Police Youth Foundation and the Bridges to Brighter Futures Program, proudly supported by the Shaw Family Foundation.

BRIDGES TO BRIGHTER FUTURES



Coming Up in 2023:

Our Bridges to Brighter Futures Program would not be possible without the funding provided by Shaw Family Foundation. Thanks to their generous gift, CPYF is able to partner with the Calgary Police Service to host a variety of community engagement events and initiatives.

All of these initiatives provide the opportunity for children, youth and their families to positively interact with members of the Calgary Police Service in their own neighbourhoods, helping to break down barriers between community members and police.

This year, we have many Bridges to Brighter Future initiatives planned, some of which are listed below:

- An Easter Egg Hunt for visually impaired children and youth hosted by CPYF, the Calgary Police Service Tactical Unit and the Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB)
- **Bike Safety Day**, which provides select students with a brand new bike and helmet while learning how to ride safely with members of CPS District 8
- A fun holiday shopping spree, known as Operation Empowering Youth, which provides children and youth with the opportunity to shop with an officer with a mall gift card provided by CPYF
- Our annual **Holiday Hamper Campaign**, which provides 1,000 children and youth with a hamper stuffed with food, personal care items, books, toys and more during the holidays
- Our annual **Backpack Drive**, where 1,000 Indigenous and marginalized students will receive customized backpacks full of school supplies and healthy snack to start the school year off on the right foot
